ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Reside in the City of Chicago
- Household Income < 300% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
- Student currently enrolled in a K-12 Public or Private School
- Student has a Disability covered by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

WHAT IS THE DIVERSE LEARNERS RECOVERY FUND?

The Diverse Learners Recovery Fund, a collaboration between the Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities (MOPD) and Ada S. McKinley Community Services, Inc., is dedicated to aiding families of students with disabilities impacted by COVID-19. It operates as a lottery-style grant drawing, offering a one-time cash grant of \$500 to eligible students with disabilities. Up to 8,000 will be selected through the lottery to receive the grant. Applying for the grant will not guarantee that you will receive the funds. If selected, recipients will have up to 90 days to select a payment method.

List of Acceptable Documents That Can Be Used as Proof of Eligibility

You will need to have at least one verification document for each bolded section listed below. For household income, you may need multiple documents, including information from other household members.

Please note that completing an application does not guarantee that you will receive the funds. If selected, recipients will have up to 90 days to select a payment method.

- **Proof of identity, including residency:** Driver's licenses, State ID, US Passport, City Key ID, Military ID, or other document that shows your name and current city of Chicago address.
- **Proof of income requirement:** Public Aid Determination Letter (SNAP, TANF, etc.), current award letter for (Social Security Income) SSI / (Social Security Disability Income) SSDI Income, pension/annuity income, paycheck stubs covering 30 days or employer's letter on letterhead giving monthly income, unemployment benefits, child support documents, 2022 or 2023 tax returns, 2023 W-2s, VA benefits, verified enrollment in the Federal Free or Reduced Priced Lunch program, or other documents showing income.
- **Proof of legal guardianship of student:** Birth Certificate, adoption certificate, foster care agreement, or other document showing legal relationship to child.
- **Proof of student being enrolled in school:** Report card, enrollment documentation, Free or Reduced Lunch Program, current class schedule, other document showing current enrollment in public, private or charter school.
- **Proof of child's disability:** SSDI determination letter, Individualized Educational Plan (IEP), 504 Plan, a doctor's note providing verification of a disability or other official document verifying disability.
