An Extension of our Commitment to Education

The Revie Sorey Trunk Scholarships are named in honor of our former Educational Services Director and retired Chicago Bear (1975-1983). Revie trailblazed the program 18 years ago when he learned that our college-bound students were burdened by the expenses of dorm room and school supplies not covered by grants and scholarships.

The Trunk Scholarships are an important extension of our acclaimed College & Career Preparation Program serving more than 1,600 Chicago Public School students annually. Pioneered by the late Silas Purnell in the 1960s, the program has placed more than 75,000 youth in more than 400 colleges and universities throughout the United States.

We begin guiding students in exploring careers and preparing them for college as early as middle school through crucial services that include tutoring and mentoring, academic and career counseling, college tours, college placement, and assistance in obtaining financial aid and scholarships.

Brian Jackson is a morning news anchor and reporter for Fox Chicago who grew up just outside the city in Matteson, IL. Around the 6th grade, he met a local sportscaster who inspired him to pursue a career in journalism. He began reading the announcements at church and attended Rich South High School where he wrote for the school newspaper.

Brian went on to graduate from Howard University then spent about a decade working mainly behind the scenes at Comcast SportsNet. He later became a news anchor for WJXT-TV in Jacksonville, Florida; WTXL-TV in Tallahassee, Florida; and Fox 13 in Seattle.

He returned to his hometown in 2024 and joined Fox 32 as co-anchor for Good Day Chicago. He can be seen pinch hitting for the sports department, covering the teams he grew up rooting for (it's Southsiders all day over the Cubs in case you were wondering).

Outside of work, Brian enjoys being physically active. He has mentored for Big Brothers Big Sisters and volunteered at local schools in the cities he has worked in.

Myetie Hamilton brings over 25 years of experience leading innovative change in Chicago's education, non-profit, and public sectors. She is the Chief Executive Officer of Leadership Greater Chicago (LGC), the region's premier organization for fostering and growing civic leadership. She is the first Black woman to hold this role.

Before joining LGC, Myetie served most recently as the Executive Director of City Year Chicago. She also served as Executive Director of EPIC Academy and had an extensive career with Chicago Public Schools (CPS). Myetie served as former President of the Chicago Park District and a Commissioner for the Public Building Commission of Chicago. She is Vice Chair for the Provident Foundation and a board member of the Museum of Science and Industry and A Better Chicago.

Myetie has been acknowledged by Crain's Chicago Business as a Notable Leader in Community Development, a Notable Black Leader, and Who's Who in Chicago Business 2026. She is a 2025 Chicago United BLC honoree and has been recognized by lifestyle media outlet Make It Better as one of Chicago's 38 Top Black Women of Impact and by the Chicago Defender as a 2018 Women of Excellence Award recipient.

She holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama A&M University, a master's degree from the Illinois Institute of Technology, and has been a Leadership Greater Chicago Fellow since 2016.

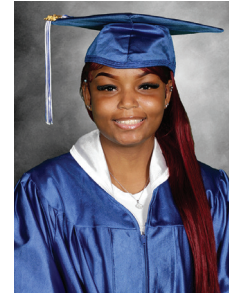
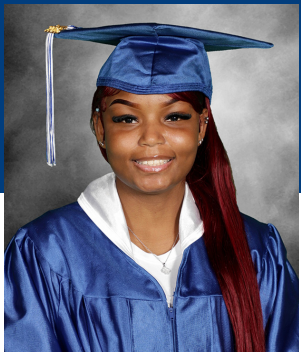

As a proud Haitian woman, I understand the importance of cultural identity and representation in healthcare. I have overcome personal obstacles, moments of misunderstanding, and academic challenges by learning to motivate myself, stay disciplined, and persevere.
